- With December approaching, we are looking forward to Christmas related events. - Some you might be wondering: What is Come - Along K? This is an umbrella title we have given to all our optional JK & SK programs. These programs include: Jubilee Friday (every Friday for JK students only), Mes Amis Français (every other Friday for SK students only), and extended JK/SK (combined classes for JK and SK students on their off days). Because these programs are offered as optionals or electives, you can select any program that suits your needs. There will be extra tuition and bus transportation fees associated with your selections. The *Come - Along K* registration form (#675) will be included in all our JK and SK packages.
