Carbon Monoxide Alarms

CO Alarms are Now Law in Ontario

Who Needs CO Alarms?

Carbon Monoxide Alarms must be installed in any residential building where there is a fuel-burning appliance (furnaces, gas stoves, etc.), a fireplace, or an attached vehicle garage

Where are CO Alarms Required to be Installed?

- If the fuel-burning appliance or fireplace is installed in the residential unit (house/apartment/condo):
 CO alarms are installed outside of all sleeping areas
- 2. If the fuel-burning appliance is installed in a service room (i.e separate boiler room):
 - CO alarms are installed in the service room, AND outside of all sleeping areas in residential units that share a common wall, floor or ceiling with the service room
- In residential buildings with an attached garage:
 CO alarms are installed <u>outside of all sleeping areas</u> in residential units that share a <u>common wall, floor or ceiling</u> with the garage

Compliance Times

Buildings with no more than 6 residential units must comply by **April 15, 2015**.

Buildings with more than 6 residential units must comply by October 15, 2015.

Carbon Monoxide Alarms can be:

- Hard-wired
- · Battery operated, or
- Plug-in type
